




The local population declined by 3.0 percent between 2012 and 2022. This was a loss of 9,200 residents, showing a total population of 301,400.




- Michigan's population grew by 1.4 percent between 2012 and 2022.
- The state added just over 135,800 residents by 2022.
- Nationwide, the population rose by more than six percent over this period.


Upper Peninsula Michigan Works! had roughly one-third of its population between ages 25 to 54. The area was older than the statewide average, with more individuals ages 55 and older.



The Upper Peninsula was less diverse compared to Michigan. The area's share of White residents was around 10 percentage points higher than the statewide average.




The Upper Peninsula Michigan Works! residents held a lower level of educational attainment, on average, than statewide. Over one-third had a high school diploma as the highest attainment level.




The area's jobless rate was lower compared to all other listed years. Since 2017, the number of unemployed in the area decreased by 17.0 percent (-1,500 individuals).

Unemployment Rates by Area and Year




The area's jobless rates by age and gender were similar to statewide averages. Like Michigan, the highest unemployment rate was for those age 16 to 19.




The unemployment rate for those who are Black/African American was notably higher than all other demographic groups, both in the Upper Peninsula and Michigan.

Unemployment Rates by Race and Ethnicity




The share of older individuals in the area was greater than the statewide average. However, these individuals had a lower labor force participation rate and a higher jobless rate.




The top three industries represented over half the jobs in the Upper Peninsula area, similar to the state. The largest difference between the area and the state was within *Professional and business services*.

Distribution of Industry Jobs, Second Quarter 2023




Many industries grew at least slightly since 2017. The most notable decline was within *Information* (-24.2 percent) for the area. This is in stark contrast to the growth of this sector at the state level.





Upper Peninsula Michigan Works! poverty rate was 13.9 percent compared to 13.1 percent across Michigan. The area's Black/African American residents had a notably high rate of poverty compared to all other groups and Michigan.

There were 15,100 online job postings in the area during 2023. Over 13 percent of all available advertisements in Upper Peninsula were within the top three jobs.



Females made up more than half of assistance recipients compared to males in both the area and the state. Those ages 22 to 44 were the largest demographic of recipients by age group.


Assistance Program Recipients by Gender and Age

The area had just over 10,100 program recipients in December 2023. Of these, more than three-quarters were White residents compared to just half statewide and just over one-tenth were Native American.

Assistance Program Recipients by Race and Ethnicity



About 16.4 percent of Upper Peninsula's population was reported to have a disability. Unlike Michigan, more males than females in the area were reported to have a disability.
